	CONSIDERING that landslides occurred on the territory of the municipality of Shigawake in May 2017 and that the MTQ, following an emergency intervention, now plans to finalize this work to ensure the sustainability of the road in the longer term.
	CONSIDERING that the proposed works is justified by geotechnical and hydraulic analyses that frame the design of the works.
	CONSIDERING that the connectivity of Highway 132 in this part of the territory is essential, as there is no detour route. It is important to ensure the sustainability of the road link for emergencies and to enable the maintenance of essential economic activities.

Resolution 2020.05.62	Resolution temporary closure of Ken Duguay Park, road stop and closure of day camp.
	It is proposed by Councilor Chapados, supported by Councilor Gagnon and unanimously resolute that considering the current situation with COVID-19, the council wants to take all precautions to protect the population. The park and the traffic stop will be closed temporarily, in accordance with the guidelines of the Ministry. The council has taken the decision to close the day camp for this year.

TEQC Resolution

Resolution 2020.05.63 It was proposed by Councilor Skene, supported by Councilor Beebe, unanimously resolved, that the municipality mandate the ARPO Group to produce an intervention plan, to help identify intervention priorities on targeted roads. The cost estimated cost is approximately \$7,000 that is eligible for the TECQ program as a priority 2 as it aims to improve knowledge about infrastructure. This study would determine the interventions and preliminarily assess the costs associated with these interventions. Resolution to account for costs related to COVID-19. Resolution 2020.05.64 It was proposed by Councilor Beebe, supported by Councilor Blais, unanimously resolved, that due to the situation related to COVID-19, the municipality must incur additional unbudgeted costs to protect the health of the population, council members and municipal employees, and to comply with the ministry's directives. An account has been set up by the municipality to account for all invoices incurred during this pandemic.
